- 3. Submit one copy in standard manuscript format— typed, one side only, double spaced (single spaced for poetry).
- 4. Only one entry per category. A \$5.00 fee is required for each entry.
- 5. Include a cover sheet with title, category, author's name, mail address, e-mail address, and phone number. Do **NOT** put author's name on manuscript.
- 6. Entries and payment must be submitted no later than March 1, 2012.
- 7. Entries not in compliance with procedures and rules will be disqualified.
- 8. Send contest entries and payment with registration to:
